
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## **ARKANSAS AVERAGE COVERED EMPLOYMENT AND EARNINGS BY COUNTY AND INDUSTRY, 1996**

### **DESCRIPTION OF DATA**

Tables contained in this report represent average monthly employment, total payroll data, and average weekly earnings by industry and county for the calendar year 1996. These data were compiled from quarterly contribution and wage reports submitted by employers subject to the Arkansas Employment Security Law. A firm is an employing unit comprised of a single physical location where business is conducted, production takes place, or services are provided. Employment data represents a monthly average for the year by industry on a statewide and county basis. Payroll data represents the total earnings paid during the year and are also shown by industry for the state and in publishable groups in each county.

### **INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION**

Previously published industry data will not be comparable in all instances with currently published data since industry codes have been revised according to the following Manuals: (a) manufacturing industries were coded according to the 1945 Standard Industrial Manual until December 31, 1957, while nonmanufacturing industries were coded under the Social Security Board Industrial Classification Manual (1942); (b) between January 1, 1958 and December 31, 1967, industry codes were assigned under the 1957 Standard

Average weekly earnings data are computed from total earnings reported by all establishments subject to the Arkansas Employment Security Law and are not to be confused with wage rates prevailing in various industries. Neither are these earnings to be confused with the monthly series of average weekly earnings of production workers that appear in the Arkansas Labor Market Trends and in other labor area releases. In addition, there are tables included which give total covered employment and manufacturing employment by months, quarterly payrolls, and average weekly earnings for the years 1990 through 1996. Tables appearing in the Appendix give average covered employment and average weekly earnings by county.

Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual; (c) between January 1, 1968 and December 31, 1974, industry codes were assigned under the 1967 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual; (d) between January 1, 1975 and December 31, 1987, industry codes were assigned under the 1972 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual; and (e) since January 1, 1988, industry codes have been assigned under the 1987 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual.

## **DEFINITION OF COVERED EMPLOYMENT, EARNINGS, AND AVERAGE WEEKLY EARNINGS**

Covered employment is the number of workers employed by employers subject to the Arkansas Employment Security Law during the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. An employer is subject to the law when he has employed one or more employees in each of ten days during the current or preceding calendar year.

Currently excluded from coverage is employment covered by the Railroad Unemployment Insurance Act; some domestic service workers; employees of small agricultural establishments; self-employed and unpaid family workers; insurance and real estate agents who are on commission only; and employees of churches and religious organizations, except separately incorporated schools. The payroll information in this publication includes all wages and salaries paid to covered employees by their employers including bonuses, commissions, and cash values of remuneration received in any

medium other than cash. These wages include both taxable and nontaxable wages. Only the first \$9,000 paid to each worker by an employer in the calendar year is taxable under the Arkansas Employment Security Law.

The average covered employment and average weekly earnings data, included in tables in this publication, were computed in the following manner: Employment data for the twelve months were totaled and divided by 12 to secure the average employment for the year. Total earnings for the year were divided by the average employment to secure the average annual earnings per employee. The average annual earnings per employee were then divided by 52 (number of weeks in a year) to secure the average weekly earnings per employee for the year.

## **COUNTY CLASSIFICATION**

Employment and payroll data by county are classified according to the county where the workers are employed. Employers with operations in more than one county are requested to furnish this agency with a breakdown of employment and wages for at least one quarter of each year by the counties in which they operate. This information is invaluable in the preparation of monthly employment, payroll, and average weekly earnings figures by county. Employment, payroll, and average weekly earnings data for multi-area employers

who do not furnish county data each quarter of the year are pro-rated by county on the basis of one quarter's information.

The "rest-of-state" data includes firms which did not provide a county breakdown of employment and payrolls. It also includes sales and other type personnel with no permanent place of work, as well as employment of employers with no established place of business in Arkansas.

## SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENTS DURING CALENDAR YEAR 1996

### AVERAGE COVERED EMPLOYMENT


Covered employment in Arkansas averaged 1,039,357 in 1996. This represented an increase of 17,917, or 1.8 percent, from the level of 1,021,440 recorded in 1995. Manufacturing industries experienced an over-the-year decrease while nonmanufacturing industries recorded an increase. The manufacturing sector decreased 5,125 to an average of 253,407, while nonmanufacturing industries rose 23,042 to average 785,950.

Wholesale and retail trade posted a gain of 4,758 and led all industries with an average of 247,588. Services ranked second with an average of 224,276 and experienced a gain of 9,561. State and local government increased 3,235 to rank third with an average of 146,101:

Apparel and other textile products posted the largest loss (-2,105) among the manufacturing industry groups to average 9,141. Other manufacturing industries with significant decreases were electronic and other electrical equipment (-1,143) and industrial machinery and equipment (-995). The most significant gain occurred in transportation equipment (+618).

Pulaski ranked first among the counties in covered employment, averaging 224,167 during 1996. Second ranked Washington County averaged 71,019, followed by Sebastian County with 69,857. Benton and Craighead Counties averaged 59,910 and 34,873, respectively to make the top five among the counties.

### AVERAGE COVERED EMPLOYMENT BY OWNERSHIP




## AVERAGE WEEKLY EARNINGS

Average weekly earnings paid to covered workers amounted to \$422.93 during 1996. This represented an increase of \$13.35, or 3.3 percent, from the level of \$409.58 recorded in 1995. Employees in the paper and allied products industry led all published industry groups with average weekly earnings of \$709.19. Workers in petroleum and coal products ranked second averaging \$693.07, followed by chemicals and allied products employees (\$688.40) and primary metal industries workers (\$667.31). Apparel and other textile

products employees (\$274.98) and leather and leather products workers (\$295.74) posted the lowest averages.

Little River County employees ranked first averaging \$569.24. Calhoun County employees (\$503.52) ranked second followed by employees in Ashley County (\$498.64), Pulaski County (\$497.54) and Benton County (\$451.65). Employees in Searcy County ranked last among the counties with an average of \$260.49.


## COVERED AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGES




